**CREATING PUBLIC AWARENESS.**



**No trip would be complete without touring our breeding barn.**

For the first time available to the public, an up close and personal look directly into the nests. You can witness adult hawks, falcons, owls, and eagles feeding their young and interacting in their own individual and natural groups. Dates of likely sightings: May thru September.

A method for domestic breeding of raptors was discovered by falconers in the 1960's. These innovative falconers showed the scientific community that endangered species like the Peregrine could be bred and used to replenish the declining populations that had been devastated by insecticides.



**REHABILITATION**

The Northern Arizona Raptor Foundation, a non profit 501(C) (3) organization, has found its home here at the ranch. A safe refuge where injured birds of prey are cared for until rehabilitation is complete, then released back to their natural habitat.



These releases occur regularly throughout the year. If your timing is right, maybe you can witness, or even participate in a Hawk, Falcon, Eagle, or Owl release.

At anytime after leaving the ranch you can always check back and peek in at the progress of their rehabilitation by using



our web based monitoring station. Know when your favorite's release will occur.
